Nurses Say YES to Health Care for Our Patients — NO to Wealth Care for Billionaires!

Millions of our patients who rely upon Medicaid for their health and other care — the low-income, pregnant patients, seniors in nursing homes, the disabled, and children — are in major jeopardy. The current administration is attacking Medicaid, aiming to slash \$880 billion from Medicaid to fund continued tax cuts for billionaires and corporations.

Medicaid provides comprehensive health and long-term care for more than 72 million people — one in five people — who are abandoned by our profit-driven health care system. That includes 4 in 10 children, 5 in 8 nursing home residents, 41 percent of all babies born, and more than 10 million disabled people.

Yanking Medicaid funding will have these bad consequences:

- ► Millions of our patients will no longer get health care and likely suffer, get sick or sicker, and die.
- ► Loss of Medicaid dollars will hurt our hospital budgets, leading to major job cuts, worse staffing, service cuts, and even hospital closures particularly in rural areas.
- ► Remaining hospitals and their emergency departments will be even more overwhelmed.
- ▶ Families who depend on long-term care facilities and home health aides to care for their elderly and disabled family members will face a crisis. Patients in long-term care facilities could lose their placements or have their costs skyrocket. Home health aides and in-home support workers would lose their jobs. Family members may be forced to stop work to provide care themselves, or take on huge debts to afford existing care.
